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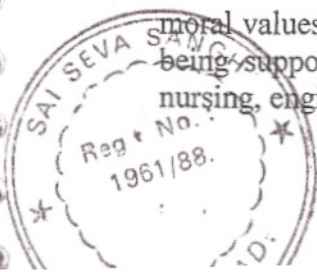
ANNUAL REPORT 2013- 2014

The Sai Seva Sangh Hyderabad was established in 1988 to serve the destitute senior citizens, orphans, physically, mentally and visually handicapped children and others in need. The office bearers of the Sangh include Businessmen and Social workers Senior Administrative Officers. The Sangh was associated with the welfare programmes of Government (both State and Central) like vocational guidance programmes for street children and women. The Sangh besides maintaining an old age home for destitute persons has been maintaining Sri Satya Sai Vidya Mandir school for the benefit of children of slum dwellers mostly living on daily wages at Moosapet, Ranga Reddy District Hyderabad with a strength of 300 children. The School is being maintained purely on contributions from devotees of Sri Sathya Sai Baba and philanthropists.

Sai Seva Sangh has started with the primary objective of giving free education to those who are utterly poor and belong to **SC and ST communities** in the Moosapet area. Sai Seva Sangh has started the school in the year 1994 from Ist class to Xth class. Seeing the interest of the children the school was extended up to Xth class. We have already received the recognition for Xth class. Ten batches have completed 10th class so far. This year 100 % students who appeared for the X class exams conducted by the state board passed, with 13 of them scoring above 90 % We are also been certified as " A " Class by Sri Sathya Sai Educare Organisation, Mumbai on all over India certification programme..

We are giving them free medical checkups once every week and providing them with tonics and medicines, clothing to all the students besides free textbooks, notebooks, bags, and other educational material. Two of the students were provided with major medical operation requirements by the full expenditure being born by the society.

Most of these children are either orphans or have a single parent. These children also learn moral values along with their regular education. 90 children who have passed out of our school are being supported financially to pursue their higher education in various professional fields like nursing, engineering, accountancy etc.

During 2013- 2014 the Sangh has maintained the Old Age Home at Moosapet with (25) twenty five inmates who have been provided with Pucca Building, Food, Clothing and Medical Care free of cost. The inmates were also provided with newspapers, magazines, radio and television for their use. The inmates have been taken on outings to pilgrimage centers.

During 2013-2014 the Sangh has maintained Sri Bhagawan Satya Sai School for mentally retarded at Jammikunta, Karimnagar District, Andhra Pradesh with (95) children with requisite staff and other equipment. A team from NIMH, Secunderabad under the ADIP scheme visited the special school during September 2013. A Lively Hood Project Programme for the vocational centre students was conducted by the Federation of Parents Association of India, Hyderabad .

Sai Seva Sangh also is maintaining a free monthly clinic in the premises of Vidya Mandir, Moosapet for the benefit of (270) families of slum dwellers. Free consultation and prescribed medicines are supplied to the patients with the help of pharmaceutical companies.

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
